Making Disciples (1, 2)

- The source of power and strength is the grace of God
- Verse 2 supports oral tradition
- The importance of reproducing disciples
- Faithfulness and trustworthiness as prerequisites for service

Enduring Servant (3-7)

- Four principles:
 - The inevitability of sufferings
 - We should accept and endure suffering
 - Not to entangle ourselves with the affairs of this world
 - Our purpose is to please God

Enduring Servant (3-7)

- Lawful strife (according to the rules)
 - This is the condition for crowning
- Don't be lazy or lukewarm
 - It is only the hardworking farmer who will receive of the fruits firstly
- Why do we pray before reading the Bible?

Hardships (8-13)

- The Resurrection of the Lord is the source of our strength.
- Seed of David: His humanity, His kingship, the endurance of David.
- Chains cannot bind the word of God
- The servant should endure hardships not only for his own salvation but for the salvation of others.

Hardships (8-13)

- Fulfilling the ministry is by enduring hardships.
- Not only we will be saved from the wrath but also we will be glorified eternally.
- If we die with Him (Baptism), we will live with Him.

Hardships (8-13)

- If we endure (spiritual warfare) with Him, we will reign with Him.
- If we deny Him (by mouth and/or heart), He will deny us.
- If we are unfaithful with Him, He will be faithful to His word. He is unchangeable.

Hardships (8-13)

- Three things are impossible to God: to die, to lie, and to be deceived (Augustine)
- Comfort is suggested to believers, that He is faithful to His promises to them.
- The apostates are shaken out of their self-deceiving belief, that because they change, Christ similarly may change.

Diligent Servant (14-19)

- Remind others of these four principles
- Charging them before the Lord not to strive about words
 - Striving about words does not profit
 - Rather it produces ruin of the hearers

Diligent Servant (14-19)

- Be diligent to present yourself approved to God not men.
 - As a servant who does not need to be ashamed if his works are not approved by God
 - As a servant who rightly handles the word of truth.

Diligent Servant (14-19)

- Reject profane and vain babblings
 - For they only increase to more ungodliness
 - For their message will spread like cancer
 - Hymenaeus (1 Tim1:20): After his excommunication he seems to have been readmitted into the Church and again to have troubled it.

Diligent Servant (14-19)

- Who have overthrown the foundation of faith of some by saying the resurrection is merely the spiritual raising of souls from the death of sin.
- God's solid foundation (His Church: 1Tim 3:15) stands, having this seal of ownership (Holy Myron):
 - The Lord knows (preserve) those who are His (Num 16:5)
 - Let those who name the name of Christ depart from iniquity (Num 16:26)

Honored Vessel (20-21)

- A great house (the visible church) has all kinds of vessels, some for honor and some for dishonor
- If anyone cleanses himself from things of dishonor, he will be a vessel of honor
 - Sanctified and useful for the Master
 - Prepared for every good work

Sanctified Servant (22-26)

- How to be a servant useful to the Master:
 - Flee youthful lusts
 - Pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart
 - We are to love all men, but it is not possible to be at peace with all men, for this needs oneness of purpose and opinion

Sanctified Servant (22-26)

- Avoid foolish and ignorant disputes that generate strife
- Do not quarrel, but be gentle to all, able to teach, patient
- In meekness correct those in opposition
 - Perhaps God will grant them repentance, so that they may know the truth
 - Perhaps they may come to their senses and escape the snare of the devil who has taken them captive to do his will
